



#### THE POWER TO HOLD ON

When you're fighting for better working conditions, having a good strike fund is crucial.

It gives workers **the means** to continue their strike for as long as necessary.

The boss then knows that we can always hang on for **one more day**. And often, this is the best way to avoid a dispute.

Our strike relief funds **do not have to be reimbursed** after a labour dispute. They are not meant to replace wages, but instead to enable workers to keep their heads above water.

Thanks to the cumulated amounts in our two strike funds, the International Fund and the District 5 Fund, not one striking or locked-out Steelworker will ever have to go a week without a cheque.

## HOW CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE INTERNATIONAL STRIKE AND **DEFENCE FUND ARE CALCULATED: 3 EXAMPLES**

<sup>\*</sup> Contributions to the Strike Fund are included in the union dues. They are not in addition to the union dues.



#### **DISTRICT 5 STRIKE FUND**

The local unions affiliated with the District 5 Strike and Defence Fund pay a monthly amount for each of their members, calculated on the basis of the dues paid by the total membership of District 5 in the previous year. This lump sum is equivalent to 4% of the total dues paid to the District for "amalgamated" union locals \* and 5% for all other union locals.

Membership is voluntary for each Local Union. The decision to become a member is made by the membership at a general membership meeting.

Approximately 27,000 members contribute to the District 5 Strike and Defence Fund.

The District 5 Fund allows for relief payments to be made to striking and locked-out workers beginning in the 2nd week, in addition to the amounts allocated by the International Strike and Defence Fund.

Thanks to the combination of these two strike funds, not one striking or locked-out Steelworker will ever have to go a week without a cheque.

### STRIKE BUDGET

Each Local Union of the Steelworkers manages its own strike relief budget and the general membership decides at a meeting how much each striking worker will receive. Local Unions exercise their own autonomy.

If the Local Union participates in the District 5 Fund, it will receive strike relief payments beginning in the  $2^{nd}$  week of a labour dispute. If it does not participate, it will begin to receive relief payments from the International Fund in the  $3^{rd}$  week. Workers will not be without an income because, when a strike is triggered, they should still be paid by the employer for the weeks owing.



Our workers receive relief funds until the dispute reaches its end.

The strike budget\* is based on the average number of contributors during the three months preceding the dispute. The following table explains how this budget is calculated:

| 7 <sup>th</sup> to 11 <sup>th</sup> week                  | \$260   | \$75/week   | \$335                                |
| 12 <sup>th</sup> to 15 <sup>th</sup> week                 | \$260   | \$100/week  | \$360                                |
| 16 <sup>th</sup> to 20 <sup>th</sup> week                 | \$260   | \$125/week  | \$385                                |
| 21st week and after                                       | \$260   | \$150/week  | \$410                                |

**Please note:** During a lockout, members receive \$260 per week from the International Strike and Defence Fund, as of the beginning of the lockout. This payment continues throughout the lockout. As well, as of the fourth week of a lockout, an additional amount is paid to members of locals that contribute to the District 5 Strike and Defence Fund.

<sup>\*</sup> The Local Union receives a strike budget that is calculated on the basis of the number of members who have contributed in the three months preceding the strike.
